

WORKERS OF THE TECHNOSPHERE

The technosphere is related to the Anthropocene, the geological era when humans have emerged as the dominant forces shaping the planet. The cybernetic aspect of the technosphere relates to the increasing autonomy and rise of technology. Automation causes manual, precarious labour to shift to online platforms. New jobs supporting and desgining emerging technologies that shape the labour of modern society are constantly popping up. Some are easily noticed in public, others aren't.

The technosphere has a drastic impact on the way people work. The gig economy has invaded many job environments largely based on temporary labor or freelance work. This flexibility brings many job opportunities. Working through digital platforms create freedom to roam the world while practicing our jobs. Are our ways of living and working shifting, from a sedentary to a nomadic lifestyle? The workers of the technosphere can move from city to city. It's not neccesary for them to have a fixed living base, they can work remotely from any location. We chose 15 modern workers that grabbed our attention. By making a catalogue of personas and their living space supported by found references, we try to shine a light on their work and lifestyle. We zoom out further locating their interiors in a bigger scale and looking for the duality of the luxurious and precarious nature surrounding these technosphere workers.


1. A clickfarmer has to stay in the same position all day, so a comfortable chair with an easy access drinkholder cup is a necessary luxary in order to preform the job.


1. With roadrage and increased pressure from insurance companies, dashcams are becoming more common in cars.




1. Chuggers earn substantial amounts of money per charity subscription they sell. The first year and a half of the subscription goes to the chuggers company and not to the charity.




Retail food delivery is a courier service in which a restaurant, store, or independent food-delivery company delivers food to a customer.

1. Scooter charge station in the office spaces are becoming a new part of the working environment.



CONCLUSION The jobs created through the technosphere rely on digital platforms, automation and online connections. They are often disconnected from society and practiced in secluded, dark environments. Plenty of these jobs are focused on image creation and increasing revenue. This duality guestions the reality of the workforce. They might have a glamorous appeal through the image of the multinational tech-companies and the individualistic methods. In reality only few can take advantage of the luxurious lifestyles, while others are left in a precarious position. They live in overpopulated, poluted, insecure environments and don't have access to good healthcare and job security. This is the price they pay for the flexibility of their contracts. It disconnects them from society and the benefits of a open-ended contract. They can be artists through the day and be delivering pizza's at night. In reality many of these jobs are exceduted by unschooled people that use it as their only revenue, without providing enough means to have decent living conditions.

> These jobs are focused on online presence, but disregard their realities. Dropshippers, tinder coaches, Al-influencers and lime juicers convince people online to take part in these "easy money" jobs" through youtube videos and instagram posts. The reality is concealed, a anthropogenic neoliberal scam, with simularities to a pyramid scheme. These flexibles increase te wage gap. Rich people get richer, while others meddle their way through precarious working conditions, because of the lack of a better alternative. They pay the price of the new found luxuries of society. One day these workers of the technosphere will become automized as well and new luxurious and precarious jobs will arise.
